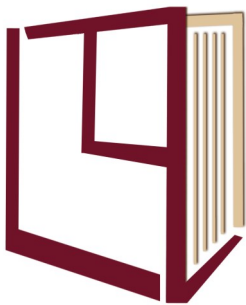

## From the Director's Desk

Happy New Year to All, may 2017 be a year of prosperity, joy and wonder! Our interior re-modeling project is nearly done. We still have a few loose ends to tie up but we are essentially done. We hope you are enjoying the new spaces we have created, the updated technology and the modern updated vibe we have created in our library. Please take a moment and check out the new Quiet Room, that place where you can enjoy some true quiet. Our study rooms are available for you to spread out a project, study for that big test or work on a project with others. Reservations for these rooms may be made online or stop at the info desk located just outside the rooms. Anyone high school age or older with a valid Lansing Library card is welcome.

We have a request of our patrons. Please do not plug in any devices where the cord hangs over a walkway. This is extremely dangerous and we have provided plenty of plugs where there is seating so this is not an issue. Please ask a staff member if you need assistance. We also ask that you do not move the seating that does not have wheels. If you are working with others or need a larger table you may move tables and wheeled chairs as needed. We ask that you unlock the tables first by lifting the tabs on the wheels. We purposely purchased furniture that was easy to move so spaces could be created for our patrons' needs.

Our portable stage and lighting has been a big hit. We hope if you have not already attended one of our concerts you will be able to do so soon. We have created a wonderful space for entertainment. The stage is raised so you can actually see the performers from the back of the room.

The main items left are opening our new high school space on the lower level, finding a solution to our railing issues, creating new signage and installing new hardware to our art wall. We will be tweaking things as we see usage patterns but for the most part everything is now in its permanent new place. I know many of you will be grateful for that!

We also have a new phone system. These knowledgeable folks can do many things such as: renew your materials, put a book on hold for you, give you our hours or inform you of the time of a program and many other things. So please tell them what it is you are looking for when you call. When you call if the person answering your call cannot answer your question or concern you will be transferred to the phone of someone who can.

Please leave a message about what it is you need. This enables us to help you as soon as we are available as staff receive messages on the phone and on their email. For example, if you want a certain book from another library leave the title and your name so we can process that request immediately without even speaking to you. I know many of you enjoy working with a particular staff member but there are many people here who can ultimately get you the materials you desire. We do not want you to have to wait until someone returns from vacation or a sick day to assist you. Our goal is to handle patron inquiries as efficiently and quickly as possible. If you leave us a message when we do not answer the phone you will help us facilitate good customer service. Thank you all for your assistance.

Just a heads up that our Annual Block Party will return on Friday, June 2<sup>nd</sup> from 6-8:30 p.m. Mark your calendars for our big kick off of summer! As always there will be something for all ages.

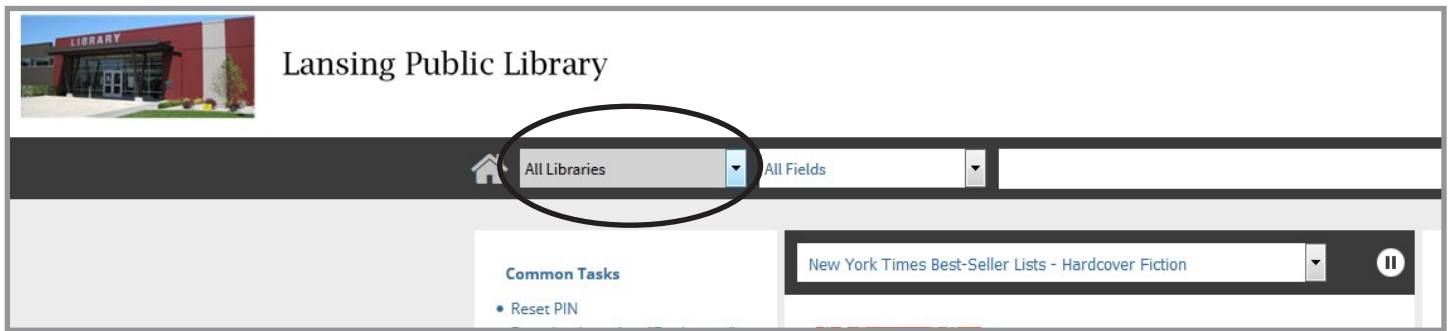
