**Are you registered to vote?** Residents of suburban Cook County may register to vote at the Library! If you are not registered, if you have moved or if you will be 18 before Nov. 2, you need to register by Oct. 5 to be eligible to vote in the November Presidential Election!

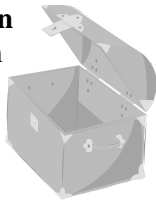
