## Tapes on Library Shelf

Many people buy music cassette tapes, play them once, and discard them. For those people the Suburban Library System may have an answer.

Now there are available 775 tapes of music — classical, religious, popular, rock, show tunes — and self-develop-

ment, literature, humor, theater, film and other topics. And the library system will even loan out its cassette players for the same two week maximum period as the tapes.

Offering the service in the Calumet Region are libraries in Calumet City, Dolton, Harvey, Lansing, Markham, South Holland and Thornton. Effective Friday the available tapes were housed in the Dolton Library at 14037 Lincoln Ave.

The system is a cooperative of 58 libraries in the south and west suburban areas. The Calumet Region libraries are one of eight zones of the system.

Cassettes may be borrowed through participating libraries by card-carrying patrons. Those with system-cards may come directly to Dolton for selections. Patrons with home library cards may apply for a system card.
