The library board of directors stepped out of their formal proceedings last night to honor their president, Lewis Flom on his 80th birthday.

Flom, who has been on the board for 25 years, and president for 20 years, marks his 80th year on April 1.

Flom was instrumental in getting the two referendums for the two new libraries, in addition to being very active in several civic organizations.
