


The year 2021 arrived and still the Pandemic remained, but our Historical Society was not "down for the count!" We continued to be an active part of the community. April brought a restoration of our Lansing Fallen Heroes Memorial Day exhibit to honor police Officer Ken Novak and Marine LCPL Phil Martini, who both died on April 8th, Ken in 1992 and Phil in 2006. The museum was open all day and drew many visitors including several young police officers. Our mission is to ensure that the community will never forget their service and their sacrifice.

Because the library was still not open to large groups of people, we decided to try a Zoom speaker program provided through the Illinois Humanities Road Scholars Speakers Bureau. We hosted Catherine Lambrecht whose topic was Heirloom Family Recipes from the Illinois State Fair. Over 20 people attended the online program. The stories she presented to go along with the recipes were fascinating. It was a great kick-off for our ongoing "Recipes from Our Roots" collection. We hope you all will send in a recipe and story! We will accept them through the end of June.


As May rolled around, it was time to create an entry for the Good Neighbor Day Parade. The theme was Superheroes of Lansing and the obvious choice for us was to honor Lansing's first responders and medical personnel. Dan and Sue Bovino provided us with their car which we turned into a "super vehicle" with its own mask and cape and magnetic stickers with the comic book exclamations like "POW" and "BOOM"!

We walked behind carrying posters with images of the first responders, doctors, and nurses. The whole town seemed to be out in force to celebrate the return of the parade! It was great to be a part of it all.

In conjunction with the Hometown Heroes Banners that are currently hung around town, we were asked if we would like to invite the public down to the museum the night of the official celebration on May 27th. We, of course, rose to the challenge. We searched through our storeroom area to find uniforms and other treasures relating to military service through the years. We also brought out the original sketches done by artist Anna Carroll to the Lansing Veterans Memorial. Dan and Sue had a slide show of pictures taken by Lansing resident Gerhard Henning during his deployment to Korea. About 50 people toured the museum that evening. The expanded military exhibit will remain in place through the end of July.
