


This year LHS introduced a new Exhibit celebrating June 19 as "JUNETEENTH", the emancipation of enslaved people.





The Lansing Historical Society is building a database of items we have in the Museum. This past summer, Matthew DiGrispino, has been entering documented donations into the database. We are very grateful for Matthew's dedication to this project and have recently awarded him with a plaque to show our appreciation. There are currently over 1,600 items entered, spanning years 1990-2022. Previous to the database, all donations were manually written on paper and filed in binders. This required at least three (3) different forms to be filled out – the log, the accession form, and the deed of gift.



Nicholas DiGrispino gave a very interesting account of his employment at the Baseball Hall of Fame in Cooperstown, NY.



Now that we have a database, all we have to do is type in the donated information, and by the click of a button, print the deed of gift. We will now be able to analyze our inventory to help us make decisions, for example understanding what we have, what we don't have, what we have too much of, and where everything is stored. There are many benefits to this process, which will be ongoing.
